PICK UP AREAS

When picking up children in the afternoon, here are a few suggestions for you to help ease traffic congestion around our school.

- ◆ Pre-arrange a pick-up place with your children
- ◆ If possible, arrange to meet your children a little further away from the school
- ◆ Arrange to meet your children 5 to 10 minutes later than school finish time to avoid congestion
- ◆ If this is not possible, then always attempt to park on the school side of the road to collect your children
- ◆ Use the drop off and pick up zones (Toohey Road and Weller Road carpark) – if your child is not there, move through the area and go around the block – between 7-9am and 3-4pm this is a **2-minute zone** monitored by the Brisbane City Council.

PICK-UP TIPS

SURNAME CARDS

Show your name for a quick pick-up

- ◆ Use these cards for the afternoon pick-up line by placing it on your car's passenger-side sun visor.
- ◆ As you approach the pick-up zone, ensure your sun visor is down with your surname card on display so the Leadership Team (Principal/ Deputy Principal/ Head of Department Curriculum) supervisor can identify which child is being collected and prepare them for pick-up.
- ◆ Displaying your surname card at pick-up helps the afternoon queue run much smoother and quicker for everyone.
- ◆ Otherwise park your car further away and walk into the school grounds to meet your children.

PARKING TIPS

When you park around the school area, check the surrounding street signs and road markings.

DO NOT:

- ◆ PARK on solid yellow lines.
- ◆ PARK in the school Drop-Off/Pick-Up zones between 7:00am – 9:00am and 3:00pm – 4:00pm. Toohey Rd is a loading zone during these hours —**2 minutes passenger set down/pick up only**
- ◆ PARK across driveways, including neighbouring homes.
- ◆ PARK in 'No Standing or Bus' zones. If you park on a yellow line or in a 'no standing' area, you are putting the safety of other children and families at risk.
- ◆ Parking around our school may seem challenging. There is sufficient parking in the surrounding streets, if you are prepared to walk an extra minute or two.

If there is a parking issue you would like to report:

Call Brisbane City Council – when Council receives enough reports about parking issues, that area then becomes a target for regular monitoring by Council officers.
