HASS	My Past, Present and Future Students will learn to identify, describe and sequence personal and family events and describe continuities and changes in aspects of daily life over time.	Week 6
Science	Living adventure  Students make links between external features of living things and the environments in which they live. They consider how the needs of living things are met in a variety of habitats. They compare differences between healthy and unhealthy habitats and suggest how changes to habitats can affect how the needs of living things are met. Students understand that science helps people care for environments and living things and they use science knowledge to recommend changes to improve habitats and care for the environment. They share observations using scientific and everyday language.	Week 6 & 7
Languages Japanese	ACJ: Green Sheep: Students will listen to and comprehend the picture book Where is the Green Sheep? Students learn to decode simple Japanese text using picture clues. They will work together as a class to produce an innovation of the text using learned sentence structure. Students will learn the grammatical structure linked to the text and will experiment with sentence making and begin to write using known Hiragana.	Week 4 Reading Week 7 Writing
